

Message from Ram Kolavennu, COO, FFEIT

Dear Friends,

As we close out another impactful year, I want to express my sincerest thanks to everyone involved in making this happen. It has been a challenging year, but thanks to our collective efforts, we have achieved a great deal.

This could not have been possible without - the Generosity of Donors (2,458), the Guidance of Mentors (1,241), the Commitment of Alumni (1,530), Hard work of selfless Volunteers (1,027) and our eco-system partners and other NGOs (52).

While the numbers are evident, the work that has gone behind achieving this is significant. First and foremost on the list is FFE's call out and reach to the most deserving students across the country. We received 23,016 applications this year for scholarships – we have received more applications from girls than boys for the first time ever.

- Our Volunteer facilitators have put in lot of hard work in ensuring the right student is selected for scholarship 7,112 physical/virtual meetings were completed to screen new applicants.
- 13% of the new scholarships were awarded to students who were referred by FFE's partner NGOs who are working with underprivileged school students.
 Support that we have been receiving from our donors has been significant.
- 2/3rd of our Corporate donors and Foundations have substantially increased the number of students they are supporting.
- 23 new CSR partners have joined hands with FFE this year
- Our alumni have directly contributed Rs. 2.04 Cr and through referrals and connects (CSR and colleagues/networks) another Rs.1.75 Cr have come in

Through this collective effort we have been able to support many deserving students this year. It is however heart-breaking not to be able to provide support to every deserving and eligible student – we hope to continue to narrow the gap in the coming years.

Employability skills and Mentoring initiatives are ensuring that the scholars are settling well in their careers after graduation.

- 10,674 training sessions were conducted during the year
- 1,241 volunteers from industry have mentored 3rd Year students and prepared them well for internships and placements
- 81% of the Engineering class graduating in June 2023 have already secured jobs with an average Salary of ~ Rs. 11 Lakhs per annum.

To our dedicated staff, I am in awe of your unwavering commitment and tireless efforts for the success of our mission. Your professionalism, teamwork, and passion for excellence are the cornerstones of our continued growth and impact.

Thank you all once again – looking forward to working with you all in creating greater impact in the coming year.

B. MENTORSHIP PROGRAM

FFE's Mentorship program is committed to providing timely career guidance to its Mentees through interactions with industry experts for a positive and impactful outcome. FLY – Finding the Leader in You (FLY) is a 12-day leadership course conducted by CMI – the Competitive Mindset Institute, Inc. to teach non-cognitive skills for personality and character development of students. Oracle Webinar

In January 2023, Oracle conducted a series of technical webinars for FFE's Engineering scholars, on topics ranging from Cloud Computing, Database Technologies & Data Warehousing and Al & ML. FFE would like to thank Oracle speakers Mr. Divyanshu Shekar – OCI| DATA| Cloud Platform; Mr. Chetan Sharma Pinupa, Development Manager at Oracle in India and Dr. Madalasa Venkataraman, Director, Data Science at Oracle for conducting such engaging & interactive sessions for FFE's engineering (2nd to 4th year) scholars from CS/IT Streams..

Amazon Future Engineer Boot Camp

A pilot bootcamp organized by Amazon with 200 AFE-FFE scholars begun in January 2023. The 6-month intensive training program on DSA in Java includes 22 topics covered through weekly live sessions, assignments and doubt clearing sessions and assessments with mentors.

TiE Entrepreneurship Program

On 4th March 2023, a pilot batch of 25, 2nd and 3rd year Engineering scholars started the Entrepreneurship program by TIE, a program aimed at fostering future generations of entrepreneurs. The 8-week course, held over weekends, trains scholars in entrepreneurship skills, ideation and business basics followed by one-on-one and group mentoring sessions with Coaches. The Program will conclude with a pitch night, with an award for the best Entrepreneurship idea.

Medical webinar for MBBS scholars






Pradim Siwa 4th Year, BTech Scholar, Mathematics and Computing Indian Institute of Technology, Delhi
